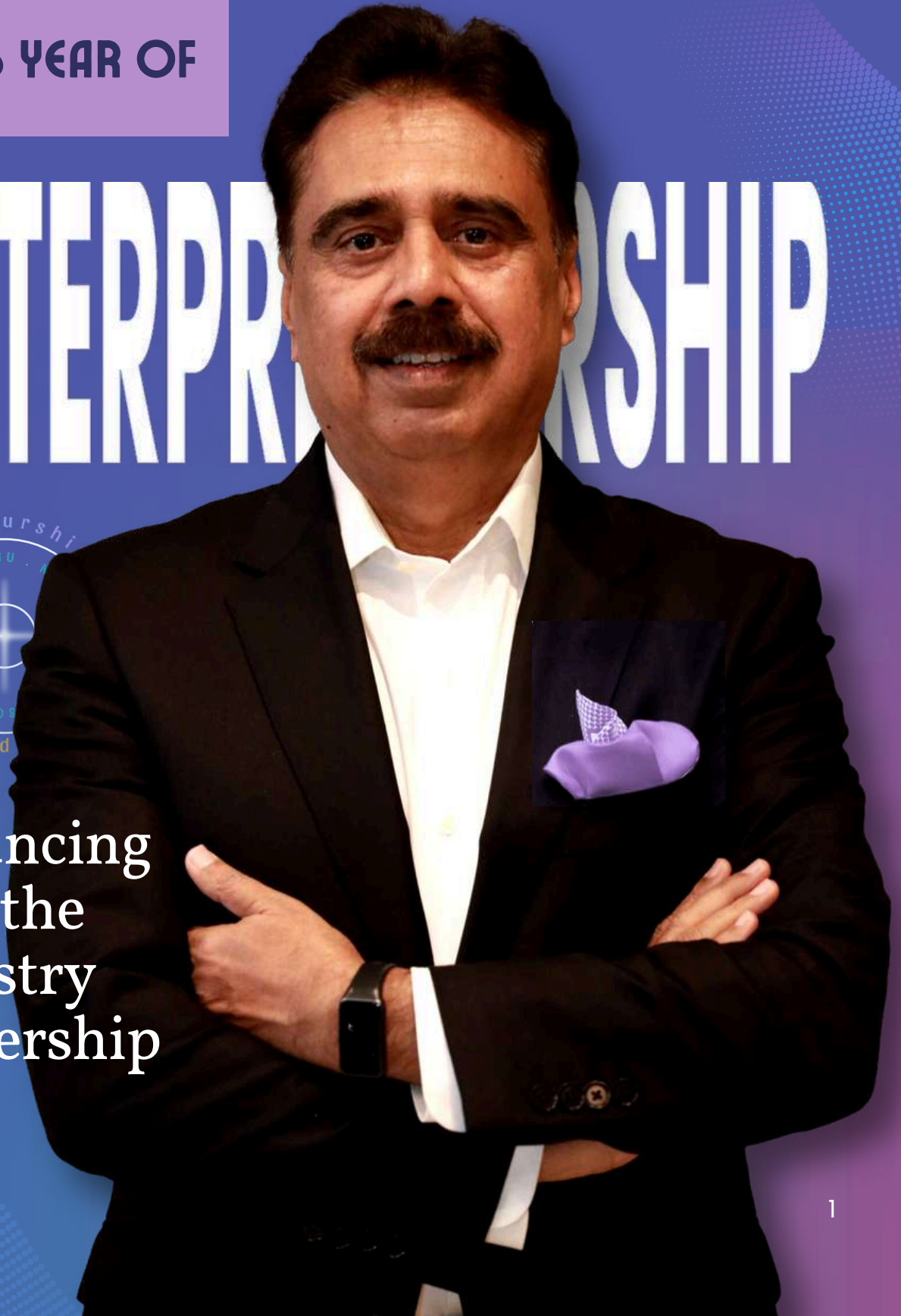

A university is not just about learning facts. Character is shaped here. What you learn here should guide how you think, how you treat others, and the choices you make each day.

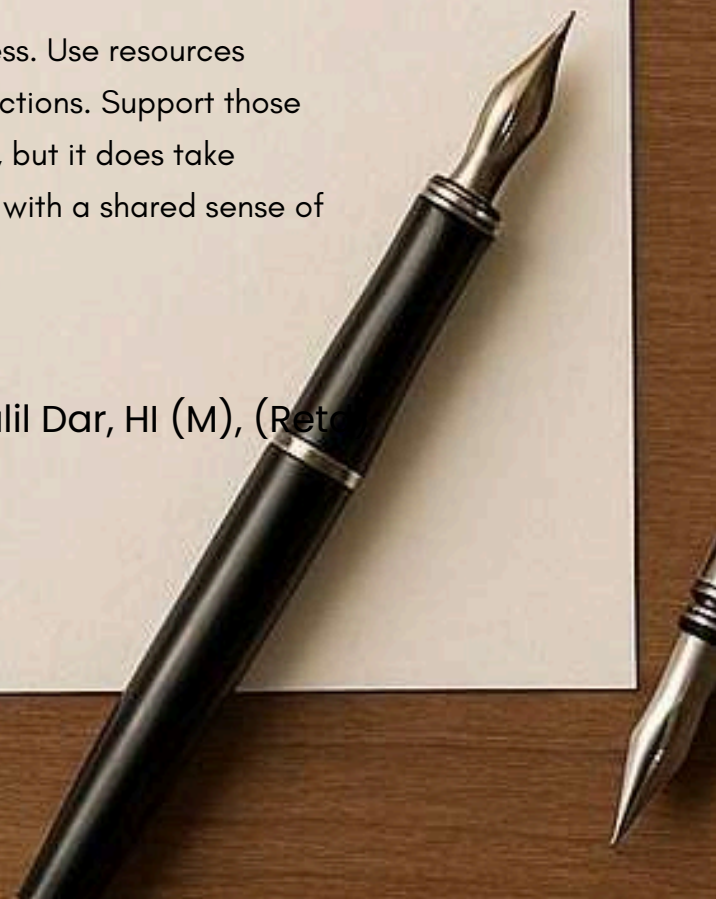

Pakistan Resolution Day at LGU: Podcast with Rescue 1122



Being responsible in emergencies means knowing first aid, reporting clearly, and calling for help effectively—actions that save lives, protect families, and strengthen our community.

To mark Pakistan Resolution Day, LGU Media & Broadcasting House hosted a podcast with Rescue 1122, expertly moderated by Ms. Tania from the Biology Department. Two representatives from Rescue 1122 educated the audience on traffic safety, highlighting that 75% of bike accidents are preventable.

They stressed that both girls and boys should self-educate on road safety and actively spread awareness to reduce accidents. Key advice included following traffic rules, using valid licenses, wearing proper helmets, securing straps, and observing lane discipline.

The session also highlighted their bike rescue service for faster response in narrow areas and emphasized the importance of first aid, life-saving skills, and firefighting. They encouraged training programs ranging from 1 to 15 days and explained that precise reporting of emergencies—floor, room, and exact location—can save valuable time.

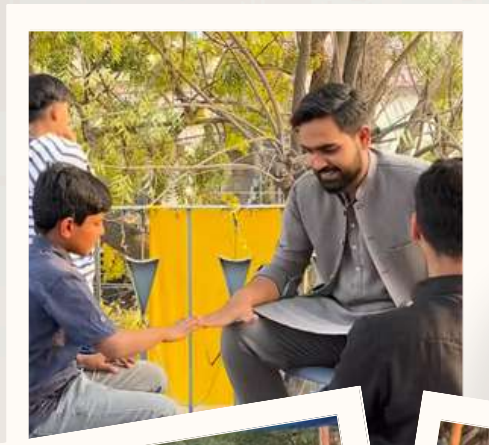




A Visit to Waduha Care Homes

Attaria Fatima (BS-CS, 2nd Semester) demonstrated strong commitment by completing 38 books and received an award from the Vice Chancellor.

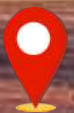


Iman Fatima, a 3rd Semester BS-CS student, read 26 books, showing her passion to learning. She was awarded by the Vice Chancellor for this achievement.
